

Surgical Division – ENT - Septoplasty

Introduction

Your consultant has recommended a Septoplasty – a procedure done under General Anaesthetic to straighten a deviated septum. This is intended to improve nasal airway. You would have been provided with a written information leaflet that provides details on the procedure when you were listed for the operation at your clinic appointment.

Guidance for Patients

Common reasons for a Septoplasty include:

- Deviated nasal septum causing nasal blockage
- As part of a Septo-rhinoplasty operation
