

## Surgery – Ophthalmology Department – Excision Biopsy

#### Introduction

Your eye doctor has recommended an excision biopsy, an operation to remove a lump from the skin around your eye. You will be provided with a written information leaflet that details your surgery when you attend the eye clinic. If you do not receive written information please contact 0151 552 1881

### **Guidance for Patients**

Common reasons for having an excision biopsy include:

- To remove a suspected skin cancer
- To examine a skin lesion under a microscope to diagnose what it is
- To remove a lump that could be causing other problems such as drooping of the eyelids or watery eye

While you are waiting for your procedure your doctor may recommend alternative management such as applying cream to the skin around your eye.
