Paediatric Cardiology - Waiting well

Introduction

Paediatric Cardiology services provide care and treatment for children presenting with a range of cardiac conditions. The procedures undertaken in relation to these diagnoses include:

- Aortic balloon valvoplasty
- Ablation
- Insertion of loop recorder or pacemaker
- Electrophysiology study
- Diagnostic catheter
- VSD closure
- Insertion of stent
- Arterial duct

If your child is on a cardiology waiting list, awaiting their procedure date by a Cardiology, there are some things you can do in the intervening period to prepare for your child's admission to the hospital. 
