Clinical Haematology – First Outpatient Appointment

Introduction

To be offered an appointment in the department of Clinical Haematology you will have been referred either by your GP or other medical professional.

On receipt of your referral the consultants vet this to determine what type of appointment you require ie telephone or face to face and the urgency of the appointment to be offered ie urgent or routine.

Guidance for Patients

Once an appointment has been arranged for you a letter will be sent out advising whether it is to be a telephone appointment or face to face appointment in one of our outpatient departments. If we have a mobile number on record for you a text message will also be sent.

Clinical Haematology face to face appointments are held in Warwick Main Outpatient's, Aylesford unit at Warwick Hospital and Rigby Unit at Stratford Hospital.

For telephone appointments please ensure we have your up to date contact number on our system as the clinician will call you on the date and time of your appointment on the number we have on record for you.

You do not require to have a blood test prior to your first outpatient appointment.

What should I do if my health is deteriorating?

Whilst you are waiting for your first appointment if you do have any concerns with your health then please liaise with your General Medical Practitioner in the first instance so they can advise management.
