

ENT – First Outpatient

Introduction

You have been referred for an appointment to the ENT Service, the service provides treatment for patients with the following conditions;

Tonsillitis, sore throat, hoarse voice, dry cough, hearing problems, tinnitus, thyroid lumps, laryngo-pharyngeal reflux disease, acute/chronic laryngitis, vertigo, primary hyperparathyroidism, obstructive sleep apnoea, sinusitis, nasal polyps, anosmia, epistaxis and other ENT conditions.

Please be aware that you may have a procedure or diagnostic test at your initial appointment.

We are working hard to reduce the backlog of patients waiting for an appointment in this service and you will receive an appointment as soon as possible based on the clinical urgency of your referral.

You should continue taking all of your prescribed medications unless you have been advised otherwise by a Healthcare professional.
