Gastroenterology is the branch of medicine that looks at diseases of the oesophagus (gullet), stomach, small and large intestines (bowel), liver, gallbladder and pancreas.

The team who will look after you consists of consultant medical doctors and junior doctors in training, specialist nurses and dieticians. You may see just one or all of them depending on your condition.
